

## ANDREW R. D'ANGELO

Andrew D'Angelo served as Program Executive Officer for Intelligence and Electronic Warfare (IEW) Systems for the U.S. Army. In this position he provided executive direction for all Army IEW programs, reporting directly to the Assistant Secretary of the Army. An Air Force Veteran, he entered the Federal Civil Service in 1958 with the Eastern Region of the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) where he held various technical positions. He joined the U.S. Electronics Command at Fort Monmouth in 1965 and held various positions in maintainability and reliability engineering until 1967 when he was selected to head the Technical Management Team, an advanced radar R&D project.

In February 1970 D'Angelo was appointed Deputy Director of Product Assurance where he developed and implemented the organization and staffing for that newly founded organization. In 1973 he was selected as Technical Director and Deputy Project Manager for the Army Weapons Locating Radar Program (FireFinder), directing that program through R&D and initial production.

In 1980, he was selected as Director of Project Assurance and Test for the U.S. Communications Electronics Command (CECOM), where he provided executive direction to a large staff of engineers and specialists in the development and execution of reliability, maintainability, quality assurance and testing program. He was appointed to the Senior Executive Service in 1984. In 1985, he was selected by the White House as a Presidential Exchange Executive. His exchange assignment was to RCA Aerospace and Defense as Director of Manufacturing and Quality Improvements.

Mr. D'Angelo joined Lockheed Martin in December 1993 after the acquisition of the Sytex Group by Lockheed Martin. His responsibilities included the integration of the 4000 Sytex Group employees into Lockheed Martin and the development of programs across all Professional Services Business. He joined Sytex as VP of Northeast Operations in June 1997 where he directed the activities of over 250 engaged in various system engineering and analysis activities. In 2003 he was promoted to Executive VP of the Sytex Group overseeing Strategic Planning.

Mr. D'Angelo has a B.S. degree from Long Island University and an M.B.A. from Monmouth University. He is a graduate of the FAA Academy (1958) and the Defense Systems Management College (1973), and the Industrial College of the Armed Forces (1978). He has served on the Board of Directors of the local chapters of the Armed Forces Communication Electronic Association (AFCEA), Association of Old Crows (AOC), and the National Defense Industrial Association (NDIA). He is past president of both the AFCEA and NDIA chapters. He is also on the Board of Directors of the First Atlantic Federal Credit Union and is a founding trustee of the InfoAge Science-History Learning Center.

His awards include the Secretary of the Army Award for outstanding achievement in Material Acquisition, The Department of the Army Commanders Award, The Meritorious Civilian Service Medal, and the Exceptional Civilian Service Medal. He holds the Honorable and Ancient Order of St. Barbara (Field Artillery), The Order of Mercury (Signal Corps), and is the recipient of the Knowlton Award (Military Intelligence).
